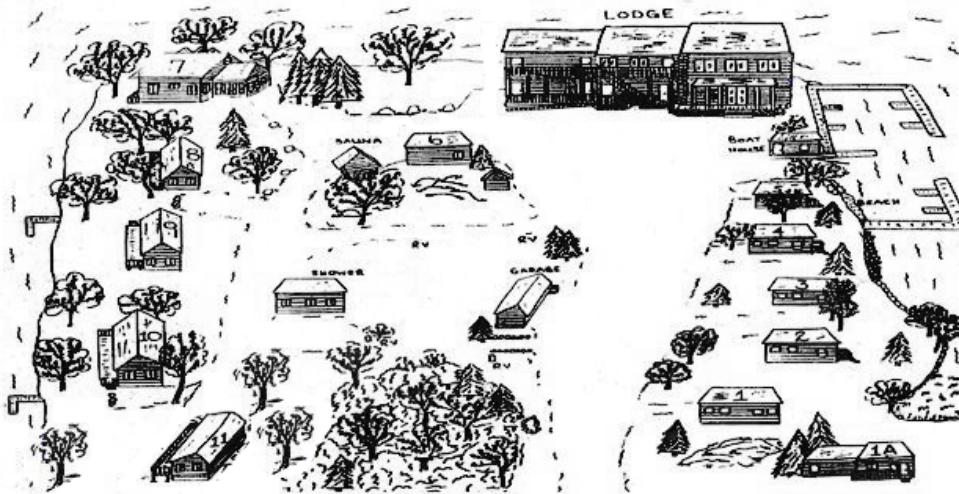

## A few words about us

*Our secluded twelve acre park-like setting is surrounded on three sides by Lake Kabetogama and Voyageurs National Park and is 275 miles north of the Twin Cities*



**Our log Lodge** Our lodge was crafted in 1997 by a local log building company and houses our restaurant, bar and lodge rooms. Try some of our delicious food. Our restaurant is open for breakfast lunch and dinner. You can't go wrong with one of our meals.

### **The resort is wireless.**

**Cabins with views** We have 12 cabins ranging from a honeymoon cabin to a deluxe two story. The kitchens are fully equipped to cook your favorite vacation meals, our beds are new and the living rooms are comfortable. DVD/VCR players are connected to the TV's to replace limited TV reception. All cabins have a wireless signal.

**Lake Kabetogama** is a 15 mile long, over seven mile wide, glacial lake. It is a healthy fishery and is

known for its walleye and sauger and large northern pike. Jumbo crappies, small mouth bass and perch are also here. It is loaded with islands, sand beaches and underwater structure.

### **Fishing/lake/learning tips:**

- Use a navigation map and learn the lake buoy system. It is easy to do.
- Check with our dock hands and chat with our guests to learn fish biting and lure tips.
- Local guides are a great investment. Hire one to learn the lake, find the fish and hear great local history. After a great day on the lake, bring us your fish and enjoy the benefits of our full dock service.
- The Kabetogama Visitor Center is loaded with information about our area. We keep the summer Park activities posted in the Lodge.

## Stay with us, visit Voyageurs National Park

Nearly 200 years ago voyageurs paddled birch bark canoes full of pelts and goods through this area on their way to Lake Athabaska, Canada.

Today, our lake, Kabetogama, plus three others make up a national park that recognizes this history. Canoes are still used for transportation but more common are the motorboats and also kayaks.

Established in 1971, it is the largest water based national park in the US. It's 218,000 acres include lakes Kabetogama, Rainy, Namakan and Sand Point, the Kabetogama Peninsula and scores of islands. Lake Kabetogama has over 100 islands with sand beaches, picnic/camp sites and rocks to explore. This glacial area has some of the oldest exposed rocks in the world. Bear, otters and deer are often seen. The boreal forest, which rings our northern hemisphere made up of pines, birch, ash, tamaracks and aspen, is on full display. There are over 230 listed species of birds including loons, ravens, eagles, great blue herons, and warblers. The Park's visitor centers have great interpretive activities. We could go on!

**2,3,4** Two bedrooms, two double beds and sofa bed. Beautiful sunrise view.

**5** Two bedrooms, one double bed, one double/twin bunk, futon. Newly renovated. Beautiful sunrise view.

**6** Our honeymoon cabin. One bedroom with queen bed, shower, newly renovated - charming!

**7** Deluxe, two story house with large sunporch. Private, great view. First floor has living-room, dining-room, big kitchen, two full bathrooms, and a master bedroom. Second floor two bedrooms total two double beds, one queen, four singles. Beautiful sunset view.

**8-11** Three bedrooms with four double beds and a sofa bed or a futon couch. Fireplace and docks with electric hook up. Beautiful sunset view.



**FALL AT SANDY POINT**



**Fish • Birdwatching • Colors and Trails**

**Fishing** Fall at Sandy Point is beautiful and relaxing. Visitation is down and the mild fall temperatures are perfect for long walks on park trails. The fish go on a feeding frenzy that peaks in late September into October, making fishing very successful. Not only will you find walleye and northerns, this is a good time to search for large crappies.

**Birding** This is a chance to see wildlife preparing for the winter season. Loons flock up on the lake dressed in their fall plumage. This time of year loons get along well, hunting for food together before flying to the atlantic and the gulf for winter. Watch other water birds as they arrive from the arctic and northern Canada on their way to warm winter climates. Other birds are flocking for the fall migration, too.

**Fall Colors** With our longer growing season choose Sandy Point for the viewing of fall colors. What we once saw as a collection of shrub maples and oaks are now full grown trees that boast beautiful fall colors that mingle with the yellow aspens and tamaracks. Take a hike through nearby trails and bring your camera! Or, boat over to the Kabetogama Peninsula and walk a wilderness trail and discover one of our rare areas left virtually untouched by man.

**Fall rates** We have great fall rates that make a fall trip even better. Settle in to one of our winterized cabins. If there is a nip in the night air, gather around the fireplace and enjoy the solitude of the great northwoods and border lakes.

## Lake Kabetogama - Part of the world's Boreal Forest Community

### *More about our heritage*

**The Boreal Forest** is an immense ecosystem spanning 6.5 million square miles across northern regions of Russia, China, Scandinavia and North America. It accounts for 25% of the world's intact forests. Set on glacially altered land, it is made up of forests, lakes, wetlands, rivers and tundra. Spruce, aspen, birch, poplar and tamaracks dominate the forests in this land covered with bogs, fens, marshes, over 1.5 million lakes, and some of our continents' largest river systems.

**The Boreal floor** is covered by organic matter made up of peat and moss - more than 10 feet thick in some areas, created by fallen trees, pine needles, leaves, and plant remains. It is prevented from

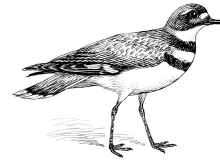
decomposing by our cold boreal temperatures. This ground cover stores more carbon than any other terrestrial ecosystem on the planet.

**Here you can see animals** as large as a moose and tiny as a shrew. Our continent's largest population of wolves, lynx, black and grizzly bears, and woodland caribou are in this forest system as are over 80 species of butterfly and 40 species of dragonfly.

**The lakes** hold some of the world's largest trout, walleye, bass, perch and whitefish.

**The best known creatures, however, are the birds.**

According to Bird Studies Canada, billions of birds breed in the Boreal Forest each spring. Over 300



species regularly occur in the boreal forest. Our Voyageurs National Park

alone has over 230 listed species.

**The bird list includes:**

- loons and grebes
- swans, ducks and geese
- hawks and owls
- sandpipers and plovers
- vireos and flycatchers
- warblers and sparrows

**We hope you'll enjoy taking a closer look at our area the next time you visit!**
